SCHOOL COUNCIL - ANNUAL REPORTING MEETING



On Wednesday 25th March our first School Council Meeting for 2026 and our Annual Reporting Meeting were held. The School Annual Report for 2025 and the Annual Report for the Burwood Heights Primary School Kindergarten 2025 were presented.

I acknowledged the outstanding learning and teaching of our school and congratulated everyone on their combined effort to ensure that Burwood Heights Primary School and Kindergarten continue to be a high-achieving and entrepreneurial organisation, with the focus clearly on the students and on continual improvement.

The Annual Report covers information about our school on the following categories:

- About Our School (School Context, Framework for Improving Student Outcomes, Student Achievement, Engagement, Wellbeing and Financial Performance and Position).
- Government School Performance Summary
 - Provides an overview of how Burwood Heights Primary School and Kindergarten is performing and how it compares to other Victorian Government schools. This includes data and information on Teacher Judgement ratings, NAPLAN – Years Three and Five, Engagement, Wellbeing and the Financial Performance and Position Statement, which shows the financial health of the organisation.

Our Grade Three and Grade Five students have achieved above State and Similar Schools average in all areas of learning, as reported by NAPLAN results and Teacher Judgement. The Staff Opinion Survey showed positive endorsement for School Climate above State and Similar Schools; Parent Opinion Survey for Parent Satisfaction received positive endorsement above State and Student Attitudes to Schools Survey for students in Grades Four to Six had positive endorsement above State and Similar Schools as recorded for Sense of Connectedness and Managing Bullying.

The 2025 Annual Report to the School Community will be available, on request from the office, once it has been approved by the Department on 30th April 2026. It will also be made available on the school's website.

It is with pleasure I announce that the **School Council President for 2026 is Mrs Vesta Vanderbeken; Vice-School Council President is Mrs Kylie Bellesini; Secretary is Mrs Jennifer Whiteoak and Treasurer is Miss Gionia Afflitto.**

PROTECTING AGAINST MEASLES

Measles cases are [rising in Victoria and around the world](#). [Measles](#) is a viral infection. It spreads easily from airborne droplets, such as from coughing or sneezing, and nose and throat secretions. Symptoms may include **fever, feeling tired or unwell, cough or runny nose, sore and red eyes (conjunctivitis), diarrhea – especially in infants**. This is usually followed by a red, blotchy, non-itchy rash that often starts on the face before spreading down the body.

Vaccination is the most safe and effective way to protect yourself and others against measles. People need two doses of a measles-containing vaccine to be fully protected. You should check your family's measles vaccinations today. This is particularly important if you are planning any travel, were born during or after 1966 or were born overseas.

You can check your measles vaccination records:

- on your Medicare online account through [MyGov](#) or by contacting the [Australian Immunisation Register](#) on 1800 653 809
- on your personal health records, such as your childhood immunisation records
- by speaking to your doctor or immunisation provider.

Measles can cause serious illness and be life-threatening. People who are not fully immunized or have not had a previous measles infection are at increased risk. Pregnant women, children aged under five years and those with weakened immune systems are at increased risk of severe illness and complications.

If your child develops measles symptoms, you should:

- **keep your child home from school and seek medical care**
- **call the health service and wear a face mask when travelling and attending the health service**
- **let our school know if your child has measles, or is being examined for measles**
- **keep your child at home until well and advised by a health professional.**

Free measles vaccines are available for:

- infants aged twelve months to eighteen months
- children and teenagers aged under twenty years
- adult refugees and humanitarian entrants.

Free vaccines are also available for anyone with or without a Medicare card if they are:

- born during or after 1966 who have not received two doses or are unsure, including people born overseas
- infants from six months and before eleven months of age before overseas travel.

Vaccination is widely available at your doctor, local pharmacist, local council or Aboriginal Health Service. Call ahead to see if you are eligible for a free vaccine.

If your child has had new or catch-up vaccines, we encourage you to give our school an updated immunization history statement.

Little Lambs update January 2026

We feel so blessed to have been able to visit and have three mornings with the children and staff at Little Lambs. To be in person, laugh with the children, see the equipment being used that we sent over and to do lots of music, games, songs and movement times was such a delight. There are no words to describe the feelings and atmosphere whilst being there.



These are the two families whom we have sponsored to attend the kindergarten. They are truly grateful and found it hard to express their gratitude for supporting them financially to make this happen for their children. They love attending, learning English and taking part in all the wonderful activities that are provided by the staff.

We also had a special service dedicated to Yvonne de Kretser after her passing last year in July. She (together with Crosbie her husband) were instrumental in starting the Little Lambs program as part of the church. We aim to see this program continue in the coming years as we provide financial support, educational and mentoring support to staff, and offer our services in whatever way they require. We have regular meetings together, discuss plans and pray for them as we partner with them to see this ministry continue.



You may be thinking about what we did whilst there? Do the children speak English? What activities do they provide there? I hope to answer some of these questions for you!

Spending time just chatting to children was a delight. Can you see the smiles on their faces? We were talking about their pretty dresses, bows in their hair and what beautiful singing they did for the service. We are also waiting for some special morning tea that had been ordered as part of the celebration service which they had participated in. It was a yummy cake, milk rice, and juice. This was a treat and one which we were able to financially provide for the children and their families.



We spent time outdoors in the early morning and used the equipment which we had sent over. The children



were able to make an obstacle course, and all participated with the help of us to gain confidence along the way.

It was SUPER hot for us, but the children did not feel it! They were used to it and just wanted to do more outside with us. Calling us over to the one swing to push them on, playing in the temporary sandpit which they created on a piece of tarp and then they packed it away when finished. They have limited fixed outdoor equipment, and this is something that we may investigate and plan with them in the future.

We then went up the big stairs to their room and quickly turned on the ceiling fans which they use. There is no air conditioning and the luxury of cool air!

Children enjoyed their morning tea snack which they bring from home, and we enjoyed a delicious, iced fruit drink and tried to cool down!!

Indoors we spent time together as a group, working individually children doing puzzles, drawing, working in their workbooks, writing numbers and letters, and building with blocks. Many of these items we have provided for them to use and sent over in the past years.

They are truly appreciative of these items as they cost a lot of money over there and they are just not financially able to purchase these. The children enjoy the variety and were so happy to show us how they can complete the puzzle with a big smile on their face.

They also enjoyed me drawing around their hands and they in turn drew around my hand. The simple things in life which children love as we did this together and just spent quality time with them.

I had sent many teaching resources in the past year, and it was a great chance for me to show the staff how to use these and begin to equip them and allow them to gain confidence in using these with the children. The children LOVED it and so did I!

Music, movement, songs, games, and group times is my delight, and it was great to see all the children participate in these with me. It also goes to show that language is no barrier! Some children are quite confident to use English whilst others are still gaining confidence in this. However, by the end of our few times together they were all singing the songs in English and went home singing these to parents when they were picked up. They enjoyed lots of games with colourful scarves, the big parachute and lots more songs which I taught them.



As a gift for the children, I made a bath towel for each child and sewed on the words "Jesus loves you." They were delighted to receive these and the parents were very thankful. As they use this, they will be reminded daily that Jesus loves them and trust that God will use this seed planted and provide the growth in their faith over the years.

What had been funded in the past year?

- Sponsorship for two children to attend
- Purchase of much needed resources, equipment, and speaker for music times
- Some cost towards staff for end of year bonus
- Maintenance of the equipment
- Paid for an open day with a few activities for children to participate in and supplied food for those who attended.

Plans for the future:

- We have assured them financial support to employ another staff member. We funded an open day last year which the staff organised, and they received ten new children from this day. Praise God for that!



- To fund another open day to advertise the program and this will be help in the first half of the year which staff will organise and arrange.
- Financial support to repaint the tables, chairs and equipment that needs it.
- Sponsorship of another two families if required.



Words cannot describe the experience that we shared there with families, children, and staff. It is a memory that will last a lifetime!! However, I do hope that this little update has given you some insight and understanding in the partnership that you have as you have supported this ministry and taken an interest in it.

I TRULY thank you from the bottom of my heart for your support: financial, prayers, donations and equipment provided, cost to send over boxes, collecting bottles to cash in for financial donations and so much more. I will continue along with Michael to support this ministry in the coming years so that they can provide education and Christian outreach and support to families who enter their doors.

The Camps, Sports, and Excursions Fund (CSEF) provide payments for eligible students to attend activities like school camps or trips, swimming and school-organized sport programs, outdoor education programs, excursions, and incursions.

- **Parent/Carer Application Deadline:** Lodge forms at the school by 26th **June 2026**.
 - **Eligibility Check Dates:** Your concession card needs to be valid on the first day of Term One (28th January 2026) or Term Two (20th April 2026).
1. **Contact Your School:** Get the CSEF application form and information from your child's school.
 2. **Complete & Return:** Fill out the form and return it to the school office.
 3. **Check Eligibility:** Ensure you meet the eligibility criteria (usually holding a valid concession card).
